AAUW funds education

AAUW is one of the leading sources of funding for women’s education in the world, annually awarding

- more than \$3 million in graduate fellowships and grants,
- more than \$1 million in undergraduate scholarships, and
- more than \$30,000 in scholarships for NCCWSL.

What is AAUW?

Since 1881, AAUW has been breaking through barriers so that all women will have a fair chance. Today, AAUW is a nationwide community of nearly 100,000 members, 1,000 branches, and 500 college and university partners. AAUW uses our powerful voice to speak out on issues such as education, pay equity, civil rights, reproductive rights, affirmative action, and sex discrimination.

Is gender equity still an issue?

- Recent female graduates working full time still earn less than their male colleagues earn—even when they have the same job in the same field. Ten years after graduation, the pay gap widens. AAUW trainings can help you bridge that gap.
- Violations of Title IX, the civil rights law that prohibits sex discrimination in education and school athletics, are often ignored. You can join AAUW’s community-based work for better enforcement of the law.
- Sexual assault and sexual harassment are still serious campus issues. Nearly two-thirds of college students experience sexual harassment at some point during college, including nearly one-third of first-year students, according to AAUW’s research report *Drawing the Line*.
- Women are significantly underrepresented in student governments across the country. AAUW trains women to run for campus elected office—and win!
